Forty Days in the Desert By Rev. Scott Andrews

As you all know by now, my family and I lived in the Coachella Valley for 13 years prior to coming to Murrieta. You quickly learn how difficult it can be living (even surviving) in the harsh reality of the desert conditions. Temperatures in the 100 to 110 degree range for most of summer months. Coming into prolonged, unprotected direct exposure to the sun can cause burning and blistering to skin. Everyone carried water or other fluids to help prevent dehydration which is a constant concern for humans and animals. While the desert can be a beautiful place, it can also be quite deadly.

We will soon be in the season of Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. During these forty days (remember the 6 Sundays of Lent don't count), we remember and reflect on the forty days Jesus was in the desert facing temptation. And while I am asking all of us to give up certain things during this season, I want to take a moment and reflect on Jesus' time in the desert.

Mark's gospel doesn't spend much time on this story. Mark's account is simply two verses (Mark 1:12-13) which tell us "the Spirit immediately"

sends Jesus into the desert where he is tempted while living amongst wild animals. Afterwards, angels took care of Jesus. John's gospel tells us of John the Baptizer's account of Jesus being baptized but there's no mention at all of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness. It's in Matthew and Luke's gospels that we find a more detailed account of what took place.

In both Matthew and Luke, the first temptation of Jesus comes after he has fasted. Both tell us that Jesus is "famished". He's tempted to create bread from rocks. How often have we faced the temptation of feed our own appetites. Whether it's something good for us or not, how many times have we struggled with filling ourselves with things that would distract us from God. Jesus replies to this temptation by saying that the only thing that will truly fill him is God. Only God can bring fullness to our lives. When we invite God in, then we find the wholeness we all seek.

After this the two gospels differ. They are in reverse order of each other. Matthew's gospel tells us that Jesus is taken to the pinnacle of the Temple next. Luke's gospel tells us that Jesus is shown all the kingdoms of the world. While both are temptations which Jesus faces, they aren't in the same order

in the two gospels. I'm going to follow Matthew's account for the purposes of this article.

The next temptation Jesus faces is the temptation to test God. He's taken to the pinnacle of the Temple and told to jump down because he is favored by God and God won't let anything happen to him. We all have put God to the test have we not? We have cried out to God that if he truly loved us he would not let us be harmed or frightened or feel lonely or . . . you can fill in the blank. We challenge God and tell him that we will only believe and have faith if he will come through for us. Jesus proclaims that he will not test God but instead have faith.

Finally, Jesus is shown all the kingdoms of the world and told that they will belong to him if he simply bows down. We have all be dazzled and amazed by the beauty of creation and have all faced the temptation of seeing what wealth and power can bring to our lives. But are we willing to put these things before our relationship with God? Are we willing to sacrifice all that God has promised to us simply so that we can know comfort and ease in this life? Jesus tells us that the only thing that truly matters in this world is our relationship with God.

As we move into Lent, let us be reminded that God loves us, God wants to be part of our lives, and that we love God, and want God to be not only part of our lives, but the most important and vital part.


Ash Wednesday




Good Friday

Last year the pantry team was able to take a deep breath and relax at least a little bit. Our number of families continued to drop as the economy in our area improved and this caused our food costs to drop a little, even as food costs rose. While we lost a few regular team members we picked up a number of new replacements. We lost some our regular families and met some new ones. Some were just passing through and some became regulars. On an average week, we had 24-26 volunteers on Friday morning, and another 18-20 people picking up food during the week and stocking the pantry on Thursday.

To summarize the Pantry' year:

Total families served 2017 - 5,628 (2016 - \$6,227)
Total food cost 2017 -\$32,926.38 (2016 - \$37,006.04)

Volunteer Team - We had a total of 49 regular and substitute volunteers in 2017

Finally, due to the hard work of the Golf Tournament Committee, the very successful golf tournament raised almost \$20,000. When this, combined with the generous donations so many of our congregation made, we were able to provide the necessities that go into each week's grocery bag without having to worry. Both the pantry team and all the families that came during the year want to thank everyone who helped make the year 2017 a success.

THE MINISTRY OF STRETCHER BEARING



How far are you willing to go to help someone in need? To what degree are you prepared to use compassion, combined with imagination and perseverance, to bring another person into the healing presence of Jesus? Can you somehow identify with those four anonymous fellows whom Mark describes in the second chapter of his Gospel (2:1-5) as having carried a paralytic to Jesus so that Jesus might heal him, and then ripping a hole in the roof to get him to Jesus when the crowd blocked the normal way in?

In his latest book, *Creed: What Christians Believe and Why*, Adam Hamilton reminds us that we have an obligation to one another, within the church, to engage in a quality of caring that sets us apart from every other organization and institution. In a chapter titled "The Church and the Community of Saints," he refers to Paul's letter to the Galatians, in which he says that we are to "carry each other's burdens" (6:2) and "as we have opportunity . . . do good to all people—especially to those who belong to the family of believers." (6:10)

Adam is lead pastor at the United Methodist megachurch, Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas. With a membership of well over 20,000, providing that sort of mutual care in his setting is obviously a major undertaking. They do it, in part, by drawing upon Mark's story and encouraging their people to be "stretcher bearers." That means intentionally and consistently looking for needs and doing whatever is necessary to get those needs met—and they have thousands of people doing it.

Here at MUMC, we are doing a good deal of that through our Caring Ministry team, led by Eula Anyiwo and Rich Steadman. Still, I believe we have a ways to go to be as effective as we need to be. If you have ideas, or wish to offer your service as a "stretcher bearer," I invite you to get in touch with me, Eula, or Rich.

Our mission in the United Methodist Church is to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." That necessarily means putting a heavy emphasis on getting outside our walls and touching lives in the surrounding community. But we get the strength to do that, in part, by caring for one another within the body. What can you do to make sure that happens?



CARING MINISTRY

The MUMC Caring Ministry's mission is to share the love of Jesus with the church body by rendering physical, spiritual and emotional care to those in need during times of emergency.

In 2017, the Caring Ministry implemented at least five recommendations from discussions held in 2016 with groups from our church where we sought to understand how best to serve the congregation. Some of the recommendations led to the following:

-)] Development of a process to assist widows with tasks their departed used to do around the house
-)] Development of a process to engage youth in the CM activities
-)] Personalization of the cards sent on behalf of the CM contact information in case recipient wants or needs to speak with someone.
-)] Development of a brochure highlighting CM services. Brochures are available in the narthex or at the Welcome Center between services
-)] Instituted GriefShare program to provide grief support at Murrieta UMC: Three series were completed in 2017.
-)] Expansion of high school graduate outreach to include those joined the military

We welcome Ann Reese to the meal team. Providing meals is one of the most fulfilling aspects of this ministry. People who join the meal team do not need to attend meetings. They just need to be available to provide meals as needed and if one is not able to deliver the meals arrangements can be made to deliver prepared meals. We continue to look for men to join our team to support helping widows and widowers in small tasks. We just need to be able to get hold of you when a need arises.
