Letter of Solidarity from MARCHA-WEST to North Hills UMC and its Hispanic Ministry

To: the members of North Hills UMC, the California-Pacific Annual Conference, Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank, our United Methodist Church, the Spanish-speaking United Methodist community, migrants, refugees, displaced persons, and all people of good will in the city of Los Angeles and throughout the country, and to the international community:

Brothers and sisters,

In recent days, the cities have witnessed painful events. Migrants — men, women, and children seeking a dignified life—have been persecuted and treated like criminals by immigration authorities. In the face of mistreatment and injustice, courageous citizens have raised their voices and stood by the vulnerable, defending their dignity and human rights. Regrettably, those who acted in solidarity were also violently repressed by security forces.

We are deeply saddened by the incident at North Hills United Methodist Church in Los Angeles on January 29, 2026, and how ICE authorities entered the holy church grounds to pursue one of its members, who was honestly earning a living with his taco cart in front of the church. This forced the church to implement a contingency plan to protect its members who were ministering to the community through their food ministry. In a meeting this week with the MARCHA-WEST Executive Committee, our pastors described the anxiety felt by their congregations, which has impacted church attendance.

As an organization committed to social justice, MARCHA-WEST feels a duty to speak out from faith and hope. We are inspired by the Word of God, which calls us not to mistreat or oppress the foreigner, for “you were foreigners in the land of Egypt” (Exodus 22:21). This divine command is not only a historical reminder, but a permanent invitation to compassion, empathy, and respect for those far from their homeland.

The Bible also teaches us: “You shall not exploit the poor and needy laborer, whether he be your brethren or the foreigner who lives in your land” (Deuteronomy 24:14). This principle reminds us that justice knows no borders or nationalities. We must recognize the humanity of those who come to our communities, treat them fairly, and not allow them to be victims of abuse or discrimination.

Finally, God's Law tells us: “A foreigner residing among you shall be treated as a native of your own country, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were foreigners in the land of Egypt” (Leviticus 19:34). This call to equality and fraternal love is at the heart of our mission as a community of faith and as a society. It invites us to break down the barriers that separate us and build bridges of solidarity and respect.

Therefore, MARCHA-WEST urges all people of goodwill to defend the dignity of migrants and refugees and to denounce all forms of evil.

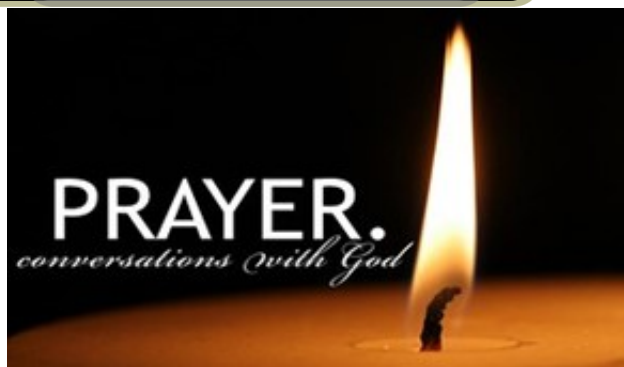
